#### **FEDERAL UPDATES:**

- We have the New Title IX rules!!! Finally. There are a number of legal challenges (26 states have pending litigation), and Congress is also attempting to oppose them.
- These should go into effect on August 1. All school districts are in the process of revising their Title IX policies.
- The rules had several changes, which were primarily survivor protection focused on sexual assault victims, protections for pregnant and parenting students, and LBGTQI student protections.
- Toolkits are available on the <u>AAUW.org</u> website for outreach to school boards.

We also have an online Letter to the Editor Template for use. The best grassroots activity is to 'talk to your friends and relatives. 'One-on-one conversation seems the best way to educate and move votes. Remember to listen, see if common ground exists, and offer resources!

#### **National News**



National is on high alert for SCOTUS activity this month. Expecting rulings on cases affecting the availability of contraception, abortion medication, and emergency treatment. Our interns attended a hearing which highlighted how scarce OBGYN care is becoming in certain states and areas. (50% of GA counties do not have a practicing OBGYN). Cost of obtaining health care of all types for women is becoming more expensive by both travel and time off work. Many women seeking abortion or other reproductive care now travel over 750 miles.


From Meghan Kissle, Senior Director, Policy & Member Advocacy at AAUW National: They ask that every branch share this letter (if this link does't work, paste this web address in your browser to see the letter and list of supporters here: <a href="https://www.aauw.org/app/uploads/2020/02/Title-IX-Coalition-Letter-to-Schools-6-27-24.pdf">https://www.aauw.org/app/uploads/2020/02/Title-IX-Coalition-Letter-to-Schools-6-27-24.pdf</a>) with their local school and university administrators in July, urging them to implement policies consistent with the new Title IX rules swiftly.

We're expecting several votes in July, which will attempt to block implementation, so expect several calls to engage with Two-Minute Activists. Additionally, this morning, the U.S. Supreme Court issued a devastating blow to the regulatory authority of federal agencies that may have significant repercussions to civil rights, employment, and education laws.

These challenges only increase the importance of demonstrating local support for strong and comprehensive protections against gender-based discrimination in education!

As you can see, there are many opportunities to get involved with AAUW policy advocacy. Contact me to get involved!

#### **Membership Renewals**

Membership renewals now occur throughout the year. While most of our branch members have June 30 membership expiration dates, our newer members may have a membership renewal date that occurs in a different month. The Membership Directory included each member's renewal dates this year.

Beginning In April, members that have renewal dates of May and June will begin receiving monthly email notices from AAUW regarding renewing your membership. There will be a link to renew, using a credit card, or you may still send a check to our treasurer, Letti Dowell (see Letti's address below).

Members will begin receiving renewal notices approximately three months prior to their renewal date and will continue to receive them through the grace period, which is three months after the renewal date or until the member renews their membership. After the three-month grace period, members that have not renewed their membership are dropped from the membership.

All members with May – September renewal dates should be sure to renew their membership no later than August 31, to ensure that your membership does not lapse and so we can be sure to include you in our membership directory for 2024-2025.

Membership dues remain at \$98 for branch members, \$18.81 for student affiliate members and \$17 for Honorary Life Members.
