


Our mission at Project Marilyn is to end period poverty for people with periods in our community. The subject of someone's period is still very taboo, even in the United States of America. This shouldn't be the case and we fight for a world where period supplies are no longer viewed as a luxury. We advocate for anywhere toilet paper, paper towels and hand soap are offered for free; period supplies should be offered as well. One is not a necessity and the other a luxury.

Project Marilyn's main mission is to assemble a period kit. Each kit is intended to have enough supplies to carry someone through their entire cycle. We are not open to the public, since most of the clients we serve have transportation issues. Due to this, we have found the best place to serve our clients is through other agencies that serve people with periods. We work with over 40 agencies throughout Nevada to ensure everyone has the period supplies they need to have a healthy and dignified period. PERIOD.

Since period poverty is the lack of access to proper period supplies, lack of education surrounding menstruation and lack of access to proper hygiene facilities; Project Marilyn only puts periods supplies in our kits. We don't include any other items like soap, hair ties or ChapStick as those are not part of period poverty.

We also serve through our Finding Marilyn program. These are businesses around town that hold our kits for the public. Anyone can go in during their regular business hours and "ask for the bag Marilyn left for them." We hope this phrasing adds dignity and lessens embarrassment when asking for these items.

Let's grow our branch membership. Every member can be a recruiter. Most individuals join AAUW and other organizations because someone they know told them about the organization and invited them to a meeting or activity.

So, we challenge all our members to bring guests to our meetings and activities, so we can grow our membership with individuals who support the mission and work of AAUW.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS

Membership renewals now occur throughout the year. Most of our branch members have June 30 membership expiration dates. Newer members and those members who renew after the three-month grace period will have a membership renewal date that occurs in a different month. The Membership Directory includes each member's renewal dates.

Members will receive email notices from AAUW regarding renewing your membership approximately three months prior to the expiration date. There will be a link to renew, using a credit card, or you may still send a check to our treasurer, Letti Dowell. Her information will be included in the renewal notice as well.

Members will continue to receive them through the grace period, which is three months after the renewal date or until the member renews their membership, if sooner. After the three-month grace period, members that have not renewed their membership are dropped from membership.

Membership dues remain at \$98 for branch members, \$18.81 for student affiliate members and \$17 for Honorary Life Members.


SUPPORT OUR SCHOLARSHIP FUND
